Going through 34 years of history during our move really showcased what we have done as a credit union. When we first moved into the Sierra Building in 1987, our asset size was 10 million. We ended 2021 with 111 million in assets, a 1,010% increase. Many people don't realize that things we view as normal today were breaking innovations when they came out. Our members love using their Thinkwise debit cards, but back in 1993, we didn't even offer them. In fact, many people viewed debit cards as a gimmick or fad that would not last. Today, our members spend \$5.3 million a month using their debit cards! We introduced a website in 2000. It was elementary and mainly informational. Today, our website allows new members to join and access online banking and quickly allows members to apply for a loan with our low rates and start saving A LOT of money (hint, hint).

We are not stopping in 2022. Soon you will start to see more products and services being introduced to make your financial life more manageable. 



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
