### A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

#### Dear members,

We moved! Moving has always been bittersweet. On the one hand, you are leaving a place that holds many memories and comfort. On the other hand, the thought of a new place is exciting and hopeful. Have you ever moved and thought to yourself, "where did all this stuff come from?" My personal moves have me asking that question every few minutes. When you move a company that has been around since 1952, you ask yourself the same question! Although I do have to admit, it's pretty cool to go through items of the past. Accumulation of stuff aside, our move has been 68 years in the making. My parents would always tell me, "No matter what you do in life, remember where you came from." So today, I'm going to tell you our history.

Thinkwise started as Arrowhead Federal Credit Union on April 8, 1952. We were formed by Herb Owen, Robert Pope, and Robert Minch, maintenance and custodial employees of the San Bernardino City Unified School District (SBCUSD). We were chartered to serve employees of the school district in custodial, maintenance, administrative, and food services. The credit union first operated out of a home garage, keeping track of members' accounts and funds with a lockbox and pencil-filled leger. We were so new that in one instance when a member needed a car loan, we had to call every member to make a deposit to help cover that one loan!

The school district teachers opened a credit union soon after we opened, but unfortunately, it did not last and shut down in the early 1960s. In 1963, the teachers asked if they could join our credit union. Approvals were done, and we welcomed our newest employee group. Since we were now serving all the school district employees, in 1964, we changed our name to San Bernardino School Employees Federal Credit Union (SBSEFCU). We also moved into a small home office on D Street.

In the early 1970s, we moved our branch to 1299 North D Street in San Bernardino. We shared a building with a dry cleaning business. We stayed in that building until we purchased and moved to the building located at 2441 N Sierra Way in 1987. The Sierra building was a former beauty salon with an apartment residence on the second floor. Over the years, we have remodeled it into how it looks today.

#### **Thinkwise Credit Union Spring 2021**

In 2007, we were granted a TIP (Trade Industry Profession) charter from the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA). This charter expanded whom we could serve from just the employees of the SBCUSD but all educational employees in the counties of San Bernardino, Riverside, and Orange. It also extends membership to family members, retirees, members of the household, and volunteers. Now that we served a wider audience, we changed our name from San Bernardino School Employees Federal Credit Union to Thinkwise Federal Credit Union in 2015. In 2020, we opened our first, second branch in Rialto at the new Renaissance Marketplace shopping center. We did so to provide a better alternative to the big banks for the hard-working educational workers of the Inland Empire. If you have not had a chance to stop by and see, please do so! The staff loves saying hello to all of our members.

In 2019, I presented the idea of moving our main branch and headquarters. We were beginning to grow, and I wanted to make sure we made the right strategic move. No matter what, we were born and raised in San Bernardino, so we had to stay in San Bernardino. The perfect location? 599 N E St on the corner of E and 6th Street. This building was a former financial institution that sat empty for many years. I wanted to accomplish three goals:

- 1. Be closer to our founding employee group.
- 2. Have enough room to expand for the future.
- 3. Show San Bernardino that we are all in for the future.

Our new building fits every goal perfectly. We are now a quick walk away from the SBCUSD main building and closer to most other school district facilities. We are also across the street from the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools Office building. There is enough room in the building to grow our credit union for many years to come. There are plans in motion to revitalize Downtown San Bernardino, and I wanted us to be there to start that renaissance. And between you, me, and the device you are reading this on, this is an AMAZING building that we all love!

I finish with this final message. This building is not mine, nor is it the employees. This building is YOURS! It belongs to every member of Thinkwise Credit Union. It took support from many people, including you, to make this possible. I want to extend a tremendous THANK YOU to our Board of Directors, employees, and members for making this move possible. And not just the people in 2021. The thank you goes out to every person that has had a hand in our growth since 1952. May this building be a lasting and potent symbol of our past and future legacy in helping as many people build a solid financial life.
