Were you alive when the Special Forces (United States Army) was created? Did you ever cruise around in a Mercury, Pontiac, Dodge, or Studebaker? Did you watch a first-run episode of "I Love Lucy" or catch the Academy Award Best Picture winner, "The Greatest Show on Earth", in the theater? If so, you were alive in 1952. On April 8 of that year, three San Bernardino City Unified School District employees started Arrowhead Credit Union. Here are some highlights from our history (a big thank you to our Support Services Manager, Deborah, for keeping outstanding records):

1963: We moved our branch office to 1299 D Street, San Bernardino, CA

1964: Name changed to San Bernardino School Employees Federal Credit Union, and membership opened to all employees of the SBCUSD employees

1975: Membership opened to all employees of Redlands Unified School District

1970s: Bell logo is created



1981: Share draft accounts (checking accounts) introduced to SBSEFCU

1985: Membership opened to the Archdiocese of San Bernardino (per old newsletter Spring 2002)

1990: Our first ATM machine was installed

1986: Real estate loans introduced

1987: We move our branch and offices to 2441 N. Sierra Way, San Bernardino, CA

1988: Credit union assets reached 10 million

1999: VISA Debit Cards introduced

2001: Logo changed to Book and Coin design



2004: Online banking, bill pay, and automatic loan approval launched

2004: Full-service website launched

2006: Shared branching was introduced, which allows our members to transact at other credit union branches in the U.S.

2007: We obtain a TIP (Trade Industry Profession) charter, which will enable individuals who work for the educational industry, immediate relatives of these individuals, members of the same household with those individuals, retirees from the educational industry, and volunteers in the counties of San Bernardino, Riverside, and Orange to join our credit union

2011: Online account opening introduced

2014: We begin to host the "Bite of Reality" financial simulation in San Bernardino schools

2015: We changed our name from San Bernardino School Employees Federal Credit Union to Thinkwise Credit Union



2015: We do a significant system core conversion that introduces new products and services to our members

2016: EMV chip cards are introduced

2020: Rialto Branch opens

2020: Hit over \$100 million in assets (August 2020)

2021: We move our branch and offices to 599 N E St in downtown San Bernardino

2022: Happy 70th birthday to us!

Even though technology has changed, products have been added, and we have grown, one thing has stayed the same: the loyalty and support of our members. Because of you, we have been able to accomplish so much over the last 70 years. It will be your continued participation in our credit union that will continue to make us a beacon of strength for our members and the community. 

You should still be vigilant about checking your credit report to see if it contains any inaccuracies or red flags like loans or credit cards you don't recognize.
